Last year, in launching the inaugural *R4TLI* Conference Proceedings, the Editorial Committee was emphatic in our call for greater research and development undertakings in the transport and logistics sector and undertook to catalyse necessary discourse within the discipline through our conference.

In organising the second international conference *R4TLI-2017*, the Sri Lanka Society of Transport and Logistics (SLSTL) sought to sustain the momentum gained in stimulating discourse on transportation and logistics industry during 2016. It is noteworthy that the Editorial Committee received 84 title submissions in the beginning, yielding only 57 Abstracts effectively submitted. The rigorous doubleblind peer review process adopted to ensure the quality of Abstracts finally approved 39 Abstracts, of which 11 are ear-marked for full paper submissions.

The abstracts compiled herein represent a cross-section of research interests in transport and logistics. It has been our singular privilege to have gained familiarity with each during the preceding months in an exercise which has widened our own perception of the industry and the many crossroads which lie before us. We are also grateful for the commitment of the eminent panel of academics from Sri Lanka and abroad who painstakingly reviewed these contents and provided feedback to each of our contributors; an effort which we are confident will culminate in elevated standards of research, industry-wide.

We are confident that *R4TLI-2017* will serve to expand the industry's understanding of the research universe within which it operates, particularly through the double-blind peer-reviewed journal the SLSTL intends to publish during the course of this year, based on submissions made in view of the conference. These initiatives, we are hopeful, will help devise a more nuanced approach to transport and logistics: one which we may build upon in years and conferences to come.
